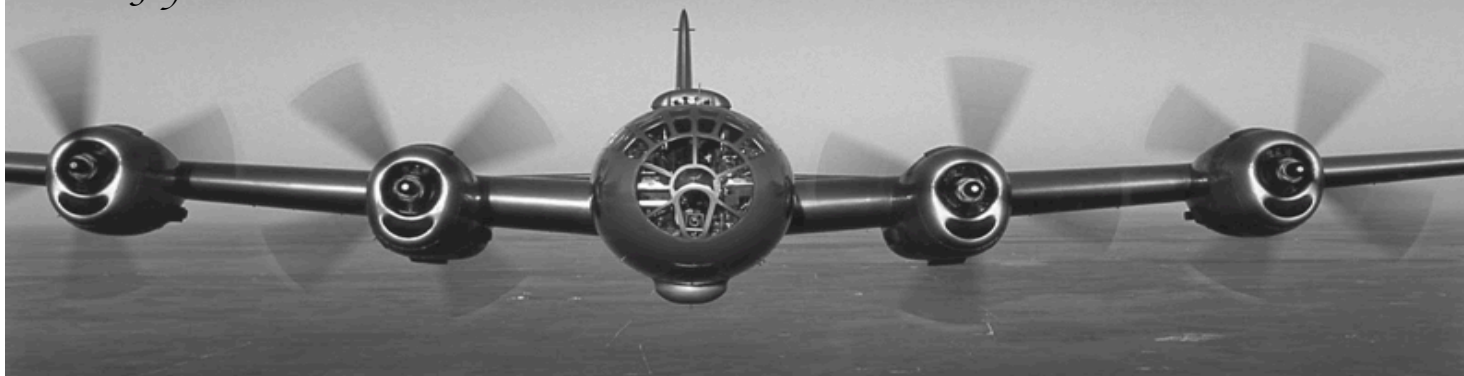
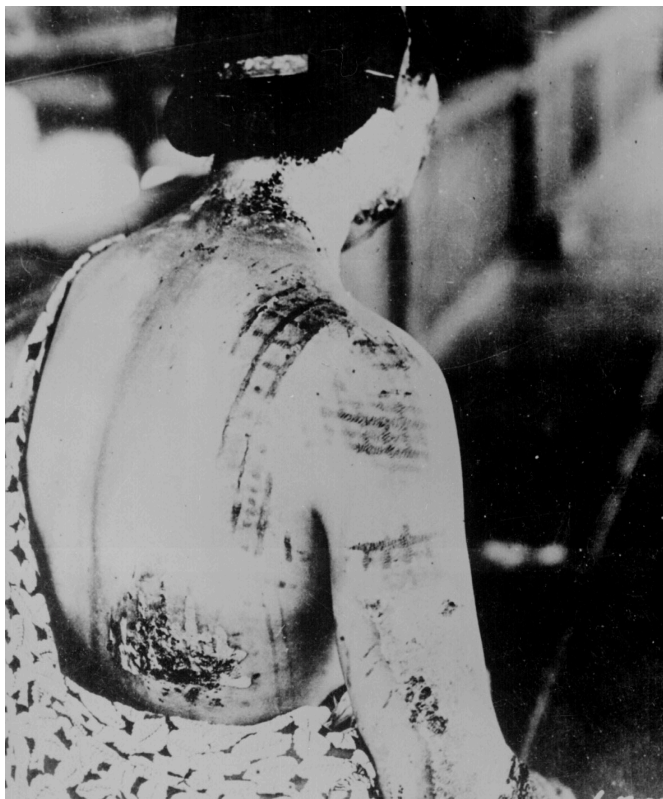


Enola Gay
